PROTEAM'S 'LAST' CORVETTE EARNS LION AWARD DURING ANNUAL 'PARADE OF ELEGANCE'

NAPOLEON, Ohio – Perhaps it isn't a Picasso or a Renoir, but ProTeam's "Last™" Corvette was deemed a masterpiece, earning the prestigious Meadow Brook Hall Lion Award at this year's Concours d'Elegance.

"The real honor is to be invited to this internationally renowned event.

Winning the award is quite humbling," said Terry Michaelis, president of

ProTeam Classic Corvette Collection and Sales.

While some car events judge strictly on a vehicle's condition and the quality of restoration, Meadow Brook judges look at a classic car as a work of art, judging on style, proportions, colors, textures and other visual elements which set them apart from their contemporaries. This manner of judging follows the original French tradition of an artful presentation of a vehicle.

To earn the Meadow Brook Hall Lion Award, the "Last" bested many automobiles in its category – K – which featured sports cars from the 1956 to 1969 era, including:

The Meadow Brook award will be added to the "Last's" already expansive collection of accolades, including "Top Flight" certification from the National Corvette Restorers Society (NCRS) and the coveted Bloomington Gold Certification, which it acquired in June 2006.

The "Last" is the 186,981st produced by General Motors and is documented as the last 1967 Corvette (VIN #22940) of the C2 series production – widely regarded by collectors and enthusiasts as the greatest Corvette design. It is also the last factory 427 cid mid-year big-block ever built.

Due to its extraordinary culmination of "lasts," the car has been drawing large crowds as it is displayed at high-profile venues across the country and will be the subject of a mini-series, which includes footage of the Meadow Brook Concours, on the Fox Cable Group's SPEED. The series, entitled "The Last Sting Ray," is scheduled to air November/December 2006 as part of the popular "American Muscle Car" programming lineup.

"I've never been in the midst of that many priceless automobiles. There were literally hundreds of them on that field," said Stan Rarden, producer of the "The Last Sting Ray," about Meadow Brook Concours.

ProTeam plans to sell the car, and its memorabilia, at no reserve at the famed Barrett-Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Ariz., in January 2007. Initial estimates have the "Last" selling for as much as seven figures.
